

2. Draw a bass clef on the left end of the staff (2 pts.). Write the notes indicated. (1 pt. each)




3. Draw an alto clef on the left end of the staff (2 pts.). Name the pitches indicated by the notes. (1 pt. each)

6. Beside each note, write another note which is its enharmonic equivalent. (5 pts.)




7. Rewrite the notes to show where they would be written in the opposite clef. Each pair must represent the exact same location on the keyboard. (10 pts.)
